## NOW YOU CAN PAY BY CREDIT/DEBIT CARD

The Board of Trustees is pleased to announce that credit/debit card payments are now being accepted for water/sewer bills, tax bills, and other payments, such as renting the Scout House. Payments may be made by card at the Village Hall, online, or by telephone. We accept Visa, MasterCard, Discover, and American Express cards.

To pay online, visit the Village's website at www.villageofmiddleport.org. At the bottom of the column on the left on the home page you'll see "Pay by Credit Card." Click on that and simply follow the directions. It's that easy. If you would rather pay by phone, call 1-888-604-7888. For water/sewer bill payments use Pay Code A000uh. For tax bill payments use Pay Code A000uf. (Yes, those are zeroes in the code). Please note that there is a fee for this service that the user pays. This fee is non-refundable. The fee schedule is available online or at the Village Hall.

# MIDDLEPORT POLICE DEPARTMENT PRESCRIPTION & OTC DRUG DISPOSAL POINT

Have you been doing some spring cleaning and found old prescription or over the counter (OTC) medicine and dietary supplements and you're not sure how to dispose of them? Old drugs should never be thrown out or flushed as they wreak havoc with the environment. The Middleport Police Department is now a drop off point for all of these items. Drop off is available Monday through Friday from 8:30 am to 4:00 pm. Stop in at the Police Office (22 Main Street) or if they're not available, visit the Clerk's Office (next door at 24 Main Street), and they'll assist you with depositing these items in the secure drop box in the Police Office. This drop off point is open to any Niagara County resident, not just Village residents. Please note that sharps (such as needles) are not accepted. Niagara County Sheriff's Department personnel pick up the items on a regular basis and destroy them following environmental protocol procedures.

## STRFFT SWFFPFR PURCHASED

The Village was able to purchase a used street sweeper so the old sweeper could be retired. The old sweeper dated from the 1940s and could no longer keep up with the work. The newer model is able to vacuum up debris as it sweeps the streets, which is a plus. We were fortunate to snag this purchase at auction for a very reasonable price!


## SOME MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION

Children should be discouraged from playing in the street, no matter where they are in the Village. This is a dangerous practice; obstructing vehicular traffic is illegal, as well. Skateboards should not be used in the streets, either.

Disabled parking permits are available at the Village Hall. Please note that we can issue permits to Village residents only. There is no cost to you for the permit.

Dogs are prohibited from running loose in the Village. Owners of loose dogs will be ticketed for a court appearance and fined.

HERE'S A TIP TO DETERMINE IF PROPERTY IS WITHIN THE VILLAGE LIMITS..... If a Middleport address is 3 or fewer digits (numbers), its in the Village. If an address has 4 or more digits, you are in the Middleport mailing area but you are not within the Village limits. Did you know that the Middleport mailing area falls into one village, four towns, two counties, and two school districts? Phew! It's no wonder people get confused when trying to determine if property is within the Village limits or not!!!!

#### PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT ANNUAL REMINDER

Warmer weather means yard clean up and maintenance. The Village of Middleport Public Works Department reminds Village residents of its yard waste pickup policies:

BRUSH: Brush is to be placed at the curb, butt side toward the street, stacked no more than 4 feet high. Please do not place roots, stumps, vines or rose bushes out for chipping. PLEASE PUT NEAT PILES OUT TO THE CURB TO AVOID INJURING A VILLAGE EMPLOYEE. We ask you to follow these rules for the safety of our employees. The DPW may refuse service at properties who ignore these safety requirements. Brush will be chipped each Monday except for the months of January, February and March. When tree or lawn work is performed by a private contractor, they should take away the debris. Please do not put brush out to the curb before Sunday evening for chipping on Mondays.

WOOD CHIPS: Wood chips are available for Village residents' yard use. Please call Bryan Bobbitt at 735-3303 for arrangements.

GRASS CLIPPINGS: Cut grass should never be put out to the curb as it washes into the storm sewer and can lead to flooding.

LEAVES: In the fall (Oct & Nov), leaves are to be raked to the edge of the street and left in open piles. Any other time they are to be bagged and placed out with garbage.

#### NIAGARA COUNTY HAZARDOUS WASTE NEWS

The Niagara County DPW is excited to announce that we have expanded our Household Hazardous Waste program to include a downloadable Voucher service AND make all Household Hazardous Waste services available to all Niagara County residents for no additional fee! The NEW Voucher prowill allow residents download to a FREE voucher for 50-lbs of common household hazardous wastes to take, at their convenience, to Hazman in Tonawanda. This program will run from May 1 to August 31. Please note that there are exclusions to the program, but Hazman will participants to pay additional for excluded and/or extra materials. Log onto www.rethinkyourwaste.com, select the waste icon and follow the link to "Apply for Voucher."

Niagara County will also host two collection events this year, the first in the Town of Lockport on September 23rd and second in North Tonawanda on October 21st. For each event participants will be required to pre-register online for appointments between 10am and 2pm and appointments will be capped at 420. Registration will open 30 days prior to each event.

The Board of Trustees updated the Village Code dealing with animals. There is now a ban on farm animals within village limits, which went into effect in January 2017. Household pets are limited to a maximum combination of domestic pets of any kind not to exceed 5, with no more than three dogs, four cats, or three rabbits, although any pets already in the household have been grandfathered in. This code amendment and limit is comparable to laws enacted by municipalities across New York State.

PRE-REGISTRATION FOR RABIES CLINIC IS NOW AVAILABLE ONLINE AT WWW.NIAGARACOUNTY.COM/HEALTH

By law, all cats, dogs and domesticated ferrets must have a current rabies vaccination from four months of age and on. Cats and dogs receiving immunization WITHOUT PROOF of a previous rabies immunization will receive a certificate valid only for one year. Cats and dogs WITH PROOF of previous rabies immunizations will receive a certificate valid for three years. Ferrets must receive vaccinations annually, regardless of previous immunization. All Animals must be properly restrained. Cats & Ferrets must be in a box or carrier. Dogs must be leashed. The Department does not offer dog or cat vaccinations other than rabies. It is very important for the health and well being of your animal and the other animals attending our rabies clinics, that they have seen a veterinarian and are up to date on all of their immunizations, to include dog parvo virus. Niagara County hereby disclaims any and all liability, damages and/or claims for any adverse reaction(s) experienced by any animal, including, but not limited to, allergic reactions to vaccines, allegedly caused by receiving vaccinations at any participating Niagara County Clinic. Pet owners assume the risk of any alleged adverse reactions from a vaccination experienced by any animal which receives a vaccine from a Niagara County Clinic. Pet owners are encouraged to consult with a private veterinarian should they have any questions or concerns as to how their specific pet(s) may react to any specific vaccine. It is requested that anyone bringing more than six animals to one clinic contact the Niagara County Department of Health at 439 ~7511 up to one week prior to the clinic so paperwork can be processed more efficiently.
